OVERVIEW

For over 25 years, women have made up at least 40% of U.S. medical students. In 2017, more women than men were enrolled in U.S. medical schools. Yet overall women make up only 34% of physicians in the U.S., and gender parity is still not reflected in medical leadership. Women account for only 18% of hospital CEOs and 16% of all deans and department chairs in the U.S.—positions that typically direct the mission and control the resources at medical centers. Women are also in the minority when it comes to senior authorship (10%) and Editors-In-Chief (7%) at prestigious medical journals.

A Seat at the Table - Removing Barriers and Bias for Women in Oncology will explore ways to empower women with the skills and resources to remove barriers and bias of women in leadership positions specific to the challenges in oncology. This meeting will address the need for development of a gender balanced oncology leadership team. Leaders in business and healthcare will present evidence-based and experiential strategies to promote professional development and personal well-being.

- Leveraging mentorship, networking and personal leadership strategies in building an academic research program
- Maximizing personal well-being and work life balance
